College Facilities:

1) Laboratory :

The college has spacious and well-equipped laboratories for all the science subjects. The Botany and Zoology departments have separate museums where invaluable and rare specimens are displayed. Considerable improvement has been made to the laboratories under the College Science Improvement Progamme. Under XI plan UGC has allocated 53 Lakhs to college, under this scheme three seperate laboratories are completed.

2) Library :

Library services at Indira Gandhi Sr. College are the cornerstone of its education system and building with enormous space. The Library has a spacious reading hall, periodical centre, and online database browsing area. The library has more than 6000+ books covering Science & Art’s faculties. At present library is subscribing 17 National and International

reputed journals in the field of Science & Art's faculties. It also possesses a good collection of CD & DVDs. Library operations are fully automated using e-Granthalaya library system. It is also providing facility of Digital Library Section where online database, 6000+ e-journals and 97000+ e-Books & e-documents are made available to the users. Library is also member of N-LIST of INFLIBNET, Gandhinagar (Gujarat) for sharing the resources among its member. All activities of Learning Resource Centre are computerized, including bar-coded ID cards & reading materials. Also Library is provided internet broadband facility through wire line & Wi-Fi at free of cost. Library is open during 9:00 am to 5:00 pm on weekdays. The Library is committed to continue development and improving all our services. We make every effort to provide practical assistance to any student with disability. Advances in providing electronic access to many of our resources off-campus have increased the support to library members.

Library rules to be followed by the students :

- i) Every student can get two book on his library card every week. If the student does not return the book within a given time, he will be charged a fine of Rs. 2 per day.
- ii) If a student loses the book or tears the pages of the book, he will have to pay ten times the price of the book.
- iii) Depending upon availability, the student will be issued 2 to 4 books of their concerned course, which are to be returned before commencement of the annual examination.
- iv) It is the duty of all the students to abide strictly by the instructions given from time to time by the librarian. The librarian will have an authority to get back books issued to the students.
- v) Students, seeking re-admission, will have to renew their library cards at the commencement of the academic year.

3) National Service Scheme (NSS) Unit :

NSS unit plays important role in personality development of student. The NSS unit volunteers have to remain in NSS unit activities for two years. During the period they have to work for minimum 240 hours and attend a special camp of 10 days. The volunteers obtaining University certificates are eligible to secure 5 marks in the final year of their graduation. In every academic year 50 students (both boys and girls) are enrolled in the NSS and NSS unit organizes an annual special camp of 10 days.

4) Sports Activities :

The college has been providing very good sports environment to enhance

sportsmanship in students, which is very important in confidence building, to maintain good physical strength and overall personality development. Many students have participated in number of University, inter-University, State level and National level tournaments in almost all types of events.

5) Cultural Activities :

Students are motivated to participate in all types of competitions at college, University and State level, in dance, music, etc. The literary competitions in Marathi, Hindi, and English are conducted at college level through Spandan (Marathi), Sanjot (Hindi) and Beacon (English) literary associations. College has established Linkages with Nehru Yuva Kendra, Nanded to strive for multidimensional personality of students.

6) Scholarship, Prizes and Awards:

To inculcate competitive spirit in academics among the students, college has introduced merit scholarship for B.A.-I & B.Sc. -I year students who stand first in class. They are given Rs. 500/- each. Also B.A.-III year and B.SC-III year students, who stand first in merit list, are also given prizes of Rs. 500/- each. College offer awards to “Best Sport Person”, “Best Cultural Person”, “Best NSS Volunteer” and “Best Library User” every year.

7) Student Aid Forum :

College started student aid forum from the academic year 2004-05, for those students who are academically bright but could not cope up with financial grounds. College initiates the funds to encourage those students for academic and personal development through this forum. By exemption of partial or full college fee for 15 students, college pays the examination fee for 10 students, Teacher - guardian will take care of 10 students, providing stationary such as practical record books, note books and set of books for 10 students, providing special facilities for disabled students.

ADMISSION AND ELIGIBILITY :

- 1) An application for admission to the college will have to be made on a printed application form by all students (including those who were studying in this college in the previous year).
- 2) It should be noted that the payment of the fees by itself does not confirm admission to the college, if admission is not granted. (With deduction as per the rules in that behalf)
- 3) The admission is valid if the student pays the prescribed fees on the day the authorities sign the admission form
- 4) The students who wish to avail themselves of the government concession for fees under the scheme for economically backward class, should fill up the prescribed form within one week from the date of admission as per the rules and attach the relevant income certificates as per the rules. The application forms are available in the college office

The following documents are required for admission :

- i) Original Marks sheet
- ii) An attested photocopy of the marks sheet.
- iii) Attendance/ Character certificate
- iv) Passing certificate.
- v) Caste certificate (if any)
- 5) A student coming from any college affiliated to the S.R. T. M. U. Nanded and applying for S Y. B.A./B.Sc class can be directly admitted to this college, Provided that the seats are available . He/She will have to apply to the previous college for a Transfer certificate after joining the college.
- 6) A student coming from a University other than S.R. T. M. U. Nanded for S.Y.B.A./ T.Y.B.A. or S.Y / T.Y. B. Sc will have to submit the certificate mentioned at no. 4 along with the duly filled up Eligibility application form to the college office.
- 7) A student seeking admission to any class of this college shall bring two passport size photographs at the time of payment of fees.

Eligibility Certificate :

A student migrating from other Universities/ Boards either from the State of Maharashtra will be admitted to the college on production of an Eligibility certificate (or a provisional admission certificate , pending issue of the final eligibility certificate)from the University of S. R. T. M. U. Nanded.

For this purpose the student will have to apply to the S.R.T.M.U. Nanded in the prescribed form of the eligibility certificate along with the original (and a Xerox copy thereof) :1) passing certificate 2) Statement of marks and 3) migration certificate from the previous University/Board; and

a) attendance b) character certificate and c) Transfer certificate from the Principal of the previous college. The student have to pay the eligibility certificate fees.

The responsibility of obtaining an eligibility certificate from the S. R. T. M. University lies with the students themselves.

N.B. : The above rules of Eligibility also apply to all students admitted to Post graduate classes.

Reservation for Admission :

1. For Scheduled Caste and Scheduled caste converted to Buddhism 13%, for Scheduled Tribes 7%, for VJ 3%, for Nomadic Tribes (NT- 1) 2.5 %, Nomadic Tribes (NT-2) 3.5 %, Nomadic Tribes (N.T-3) 2%, Other Backward Class 19 %, Special Backward class 2%
2. Admission of 2% in respected category can be given to the wards of freedom fighter, wards of defense servicemen, defense exservicemen, wards of project affected parents and 3% admission in respected category to disabled students having certificate of 40% disabled from civil surgeon.

General Instructions :

- i. Students belonging to the category N.T.,O.B.C. & S.B.C. section of Reservation for Admission will have to produce certificate of “Not belonging to creamy layer” as specified by the Government to avail the facility of reservation. Except the caste certificate, no other document will be considered for reservation in admissions.
- ii. Admission sought on the basis of false document will be cancelled at any time and action will be taken against such students.
- iii. Every admission form should bear a passport size photograph.
- iv. While leaving the college students will have to pay Rs. 50/- fees to get T.C.

About Fees, Cancellation of admission and Refund of fees

- I. Student will have to pay the fees prescribed by the college/University from time to time and take receipts from the office.
- II. For every education programme, the University has prescribed the fees. Till further instructions are received, the fee structure would remain unchanged for the same academic year.
- III. If the student, who is declared to be in first or second merit list cancels his/her admission, 10% of the amount from their fees will be deducted. To get the fee refunded, it is necessary to get admission cancelled before July.
- IV. Those students who have taken admission to Non-Granted/ Permanent Non-Granted course, their fees will not be refunded later on even if the student gets seat in granted quota of same subject or other subject.

- V. Those students who have transferred their admission from nongranted/ permanent non-granted course to granted course, will have to pay the fees as per the structure of course.
- VI. 1) students can apply for the cancellation of their admission within the 15 days of the beginning of the academic year. They should apply for the concerned/management/academic wing in University. 10 % of the college fee and practical fee will be deducted as administrative fee.
 2) If the student apply for the cancellation within 30 days, 25 % fee would be deducted.
 3) after 30 days fee would not be refunded.
- VII. All the rules and regulations remain under SRTMU, Nanded norms from time to time.

RULES OF DISCIPLINE
